#### YOKOHAMA LANDMARK TOWER - JAPAN

Soaring over the seafront area in Yokohama City, the 70-story, 971foot Yokohama Landmark Tower is the tallest building in Japan as of May 1998. In a country that is shaken by over a 1000 earthquakes in a year, the most advanced techniques are required to build such a tall structure.

The building features a combination of anti-earthquake measures including the rollers it sits on, active mass damper system and the flexible materials used in its construction.





The 40-storey building's cylindrical shape and the fact that the tower tapers as you move towards the top, ensures that the bulk of the wind hitting the building either flows around it or gets pushed upwards, towards the sky. This creates a more pleasant environment for pedestrians at street level. It also reduces the wind loads against the building sufficiently stiff without any extra reinforcements.

Gaps in each floor create six shafts that serve as a natural ventilation system for the entire building.


